COMPACT SECTOR QUARTERLY REPORT FOR 1ST QUARTER (SEPTEMBER-DECEMBER) 2017

(Public Sector Capacity Building, Private Sector Development, Environment & Enhanced Reporting and Accountability)

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the Quarter under review, the focus has been on, a) strengthening the Project Management Offices at the National and State levels, in order to enhance the institutional capacity to expedite the delivery of the Infrastructure Development Plan, b) establishing arrangements for the engagement of the United States Army Corps of Engineers to provide technical support to the Project Management Offices, and, c) achieving further progress on the implementation of on-going infrastructure projects.

With respect to the strengthening of the Project Management Offices, recruitment of a Manager and Contracts Management Specialist for the PMU at the National Government was completed during the Quarter. The persons selected for these two positions will start work in January, 2018. This will ensure a fully operational PMU at the National Government level from the second Quarter. In Chuuk, there has been some progress in recruiting finance and administrative staff as well as field inspectors for the PMO. However, positions for key project management and engineering staff remain vacant. An RFP for these positions has been advertised, but suitable candidates have not been found. The vacancies will be advertised during the next Quarter. In the meantime, the PMO is being assisted by a Consultant, Serisola and Associates. In Pohnpei, the PMO is fully operational although recent resignations have led to vacancies for the Project Manager and IT Specialist positions. Recruitment actions to fill these two vacancies are underway. In Kosrae, although the PMO is operational, there are constraints in terms of office space and staffing. During the Quarter under review, an arrangement has been made with the Yap State PMO to provide architectural design services to enable the PMO in Kosrae to solicit bids for the renovation of the office in the next quarter. In Yap, a Manager for the PMO has been recruited and other positions are being filled.

The arrangements for the engagement of the United States Army Corps of Engineers are still being formalized. A Program Implementation Plan was submitted in November, 2017, as a basis for further consultations. It is expected that the financial and contractual arrangements for the engagement of USACE will be finalized during the second Quarter. However, USACE is already providing assistance to the state PMOs, especially with the respect to the provision of an independent review of designs prepared by Consultants.

Progress on the implementation of the on-going infrastructure projects remains slow, but is expected to improve during the next two quarters as the new organizational arrangements for the PMOs will begin to have an impact. At the national level, the design work for the COM Project has been completed and is now under review by the COM and the PMU. In Chuuk, the Weno Road, Drainage and Utilities Upgrade Project is

now substantially completed and is expected to achieve full completion in the next quarter. In terms of new projects in Chuuk, work has started on the implementation of the Tonoas Water Project by the CPUC. Efforts are being made to start the projects for the design and construction of five dispensaries and seven schools. Designs for the five dispensaries have been completed and are now being reviewed by USACE, who have requested a geotechnical investigation to facilitate the completion of their review. With respect to the schools (seven are to be built in the first phase), the Request for Qualification Notice has been issued three times, the latest in December, with a closing date was set at January 4th, 2018.

In Kosrae, the project to provide temporary facilities at the Hospital is now substantially completed while design work for the new hospital is under review by USACE. For the Malem Elementary School Project, the procurement of design service will start during the next quarter, with assistance from USACE. Two other projects, the Port Improvement Project (IMF) and the Peace Corps Volunteer Office Renovation Project are in the final stages of bidding/contract award with work expected to start in the next Quarter. The Utwe Water Project (one of the ADB Funded Omnibus Infrastructure Development Project with complementary funding from the Compact) is substantially completed with the final payment request from the Contractor being reviewed by the PMU. The KPA Port Master Plan Project is on hold, pending the resolution of funding issues.

There are five projects in Pohnpei that are well advanced and all of them should be under construction before the end of FY18. These five projects represent a total construction budget of about \$27 million. The most advanced is the Sekere to NMS Waterline Phase 1, Segment 2, COM to Diadi (8.7 miles). The Contractor has been selected, the Grant has been awarded and the pre-construction meeting is scheduled for early February, 2018. A second pipeline project, Kinakapw to Lehn Diadi, Phase 1 (11.6 miles) is under design review by USACE. Bidding documents are ready and bids will be invited in the next quarter. The Pohnpei Primary Health Care Facility is being designed while the PICS Campus Survey and Facility Improvements is now ready for bidding as the design review has been completed and comments incorporated. The PICS and Pohnlangas High School Library is being designed and the plans are expected to be submitted in January, 2018, following which USACE will undertake the independent technical review. Pohnpei State is also implementing two IMF Projects, the renovation of the Ohmine Elementary School Building (25% completed) and the Renovation of the Pehleng Elementary School (75% completed).

In Yap, there has been no further progress on the Woleai High School. However, the PMO will is arranging a visit to Woleai during the next quarter, after which, work will start on the preparation of conceptual designs. The PMO has also developed a revised Master Plan of the Yap High School as well as conceptual designs for the Yap High School Recreation Center and Study Hall. Conceptual designs have also been developed for the Colonia Middle School Classrooms and Computer Laboratory Building.to assess the site conditions in the design.


